

## Rules on letting this property


Properties can be rented if they have an energy rating from A to E.

If the property is rated F or G, it cannot be let, unless an exemption has been registered. You can read guidance for landlords on the regulations and exemptions (https://www.gov.uk/guidance/domestic-private-rented-property-minimum-energy-efficiency-standard-landlord-guidance).

# Energy efficiency rating for this property

Properties are given a rating from A (most efficient) to G (least efficient).

Properties are also given a score. The higher the number the lower your fuel bills are likely to be.

# How to improve this property's energy performance

Making any of the recommended changes will improve this property's energy efficiency.

If you make all of the recommended changes, this will improve the property's energy rating and score from D (65) to B (85).

1. Increase loft insulation to 270 mm	£100 - £350	£35
2. Floor insulation (solid floor)	£4,000 - £6,000	£49
3. Low energy lighting	£15	£19
4. Heating controls (TRVs)	£350 - £450	£29
5. Condensing boiler	£2,200 - £3,000	£103
6. Solar water heating	£4,000 - £6,000	£41
7. Solar photovoltaic panels	£3,500 - £5,500	£348
